

2024 South Dakota Legislature Senate Bill 64

Introduced by: The Chair of the Committee on Health and Human Services at the request of the Department of Health

An Act to revise provisions related to the regulation of emergency medical services and associated personnel.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 36-4B-1 be AMENDED:

5 **36-4B-1.** Terms used in this chapter mean: 6 (1)"Advanced life support," a level of emergency care consisting of basic life support 7 procedures and definitive therapy including the use of invasive procedures and may 8 include the use of drugs and manual defibrillation; 9 (2) "Advanced life support personnel,"-any person other than a physician who has 10 completed a department and board approved program and is licensed or holds a 11 privilege as an emergency medical technician intermediate/85; emergency 12 medical technician-intermediate/99; emergency medical technician-advanced; or 13 emergency medical technician paramedic as set forth in this chapter, or its 14 equivalent a person licensed by the board as: 15 An emergency medical technician-intermediate/85; (a) 16 (b) An emergency medical technician-intermediate/99; 17 An advanced emergency medical technician; or (c) (d) A paramedic; 18 (3) "Basic life support personnel," a person: 19 20 (a) Certified by the board as an ambulance driver; 21 (b) Licensed by the board as an emergency medical responder; or 22 Licensed by the board as an emergency medical technician; (c) 23 (4) "Board," the South Dakota State Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners; "Department," the South Dakota State Department of Health; 24 (4)

4	(6)	"Emergency medical services," health care provided to the a patient by advanced

7	(7)	"Emergency medical technician-advanced," any person who has successfully
8		completed a program of study approved by the department and the board in all
9		areas of training and skills set forth in the advanced emergency medical technician
10		instructional guidelines and standards, including placement of esophageal and
11		supraglottic airways, intravenous cannulation, shock management, administration
12		of specific medications, and other advanced skills approved by the board, and who
13		is licensed by the board to perform such advanced skills;
14	(8)	"Emergency medical technician/EMT," any person trained in emergency medical
15		care in accordance with standards prescribed by rules and regulations promulgated
16		pursuant to § 34-11-6, who provides emergency medical services, including
17		automated external defibrillation under indirect medical control, in accordance with
18		the person's level of training;
19	(9)	"Emergency medical technician-intermediate/85," any person who has successfully
20		completed a department- and board-approved program of instruction in basic life
21		support and advanced life support skills in shock and fluid therapy, placement of
22		esophageal airways, and other advanced life support skills approved by board
23		action, and who is licensed by the board to perform such skills, including automated
24		external defibrillation;
25	(10)	"Emergency medical technician-paramedic," any person who has successfully
26		completed a program of study approved by the department and the board and is
27		licensed as an emergency medical technician-paramedic, which includes all training
28		and skills set forth herein for emergency medical technician intermediate/85 and
29		emergency medical technician intermediate/99, and other advanced skills
30		programs approved by board action, and who is licensed by the board to perform
31		such intermediate, special, and advanced skills;
32	(11)	"Emergency medical technician-intermediate/99," any person who has successfully
33		completed a department- and board-approved program of instruction in all areas
34		of emergency medical technician-intermediate/85 curriculum plus other specific
35		areas of emergency medical care in the following areas: manual and automated

1	external defibrillation, telemetered electrocardiography, administration of cardiac
2	drugs, administration of specific medications and solutions, use of adjunctive
3	breathing devices, advanced trauma care, tracheotomy suction, esophageal
4	airways and endotracheal intubation, intraosseous infusion, or other special skills
5	programs approved by board action, and who is licensed by the board to perform
6	intermediate skills plus such special skills;
7	(12) "Epinephrine auto-injector," a spring-loaded needle and syringe with a single dose
8	of epinephrine that will automatically release and inject the medicine, any similar
9	automatic pre-filled cartridge injector, or any similar automatic injectable
10	equipment;
11	(13) "Good faith," honesty, in fact, in the conduct, or transaction concerned;
12	(14) "Gross negligence," the intentional failure to perform a manifest duty in reckless
13	disregard of the consequences as affecting the life or health of another;
14	(15) "Hour of advanced life support studies," fifty minutes of training;
15	(16)(7) "Emergency medical services personnel," a person licensed by the board as:
16	(a) An emergency medical responder;
17	(b) An emergency medical technician;
18	(c) An emergency medical technician-intermediate/85;
19	(d) An emergency medical technician-intermediate/99;
20	(e) An advanced emergency medical technician; or
21	(f) A paramedic; and
22	(8) "Indirect medical control," the establishment and implementation of system
23	guidelines, policies and procedures, such as medical treatment protocols, quality
24	assurance programs and case reviews, and protocols approved by a physician,
25	physician assistant, or nurse practitioner, licensed in South Dakota;
26	(17) "Local government," any county, municipality, township, or village in this state;
27	(18) "Medical community," the physicians and medical resources located and available
28	within a geographic area;
29	(19) "Medical emergency," an event affecting an individual in such a manner that a need
30	for immediate medical care is created;
31	(20) "Patient," an individual who, as a result of illness or injury, needs medical attention;
32	and
33	(21) "Prehospital care," those emergency medical services rendered to patients in an
34	out-of-hospital setting, administered for analytic, stabilizing, or preventive
35	purposes this state.

The board shall submit the applicant's 30 fingerprints to the Division of Criminal Investigation to conduct for a criminal background 31 check by the division and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The applicant-must_shall 32 sign a release of information to the board, and pay any fee charged for the cost of 33 fingerprinting or conducting the background check.

1 Upon completion of the background check, the division <u>shall must</u> deliver to the 2 <u>board all the applicant's</u> criminal history <u>record</u> information <u>regarding the applicant, and</u> 3 <u>to</u> the board. <u>The board</u> shall consider this information in <u>its determination</u> <u>determining</u> 4 <u>whether</u> to issue a license to the applicant. The board may not issue a license to an 5 applicant before receiving this information. The board may <u>only not</u> disseminate<u>an</u> 6 <u>applicant's any</u> information <u>obtained under this section</u> to a person<u>on or not</u> employed by 7 the board.

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8 The board may require any licensee who is the subject of a disciplinary 9 investigation to submit to a state and federal background check. The board may deny the 10 issuance of, suspend, or revoke a license for failure to submit to or cooperate with a 11 background check.
